## Characteristics of the Blues:

# Rolling Stones:

# <u>John Mayall's Bluesbreakers:</u>

- Formed in 1963. John Mayall: vocal/harp/guitar/ keyboard
- Traditional blues

### Spencer Davis Group:

- Steve \_\_\_\_\_ and brother
- Became Spencer Davis Group in 1963: Gimme Some \_\_\_\_\_ 1967

#### Eric Burdon:

- Styled after American blues \_\_\_\_\_
- Popular club attraction wild stage act → The \_\_\_\_\_

#### Yardbirds:

- Formed in 1963; Anthony "Top" Topham → Eric \_\_\_\_\_
- Covered American

#### Cream:

- Clapton left the Yardbirds. They wanted popular music, he wanted \_\_\_\_\_

#### Fleetwood Mac

#### **Paul Butterfield**

#### The Blues Project

- Al Kooper; keyboard and guitar player
- Played \_\_\_\_\_\_ on several of Bob Dylan's albums
- Disbanded Blues Project to form \_\_\_\_\_

### Canned Heat

- Jug band from LA; replaced with amplified \_\_\_\_\_
- Based on a single chord with a blues feel implied by string \_\_\_\_\_ and blue notes

## <u>Janis Joplin</u>

- Started with the influence of female blues greats.
- Formed the Kozmic Blues Band. Included \_\_\_\_\_\_ trumpets, trombones, and saxophones.
- Died of heroin overdose in \_\_\_\_\_.

### <u>Jimi Hendrix</u>

- Experimented with the use of \_\_\_\_\_\_ between guitar and amplifier

- Chas Chandler (Animals) heard JJBF in 1966, convinced them to move to London to form The Jimi Hendrix Experience

### The Allman Brothers Band

## <u>Z. Z. Top</u>

- Formed in Texas in 1970
- Power trio because of the way all three pushed instruments to a very high
- Much of music was \_\_\_\_\_, including the 12 bar blues hit, "Tush"

### The Destroyers

- Formed by George Thorogood from DE in 1973
- Took a break to play semi-pro \_\_\_\_\_
- Played a few of the concerts on the Rolling Stone's tour of 1981

### Robert Cray

- Learned to play after hearing \_\_\_\_\_ in 1964
- Formed a band inspired by the Grateful Dead
- In 1987 his album *Strong Persuader* charted higher than any other blues group in more than \_\_\_\_\_ years
